- Students must achieve a minimum of 6 GCSEs Grade A*- C including English and Mathematics
- Grade B in GCSE Geography
- Grade B in both Mathematics and English

All units assessed by written examination

Year 1 - Changing Physical Environments (Investigation of climate, tectonic and hydrological changes)

Changing Human Environments (Investigation of population and settlement changes)

Year 2 - Contemporary Themes and Research (Research and essays based on a wide range of geographic themes)

Sustainability (Investigation of sustainable food, water and energy supplies)
