Key principles:

- Face coverings are optional around the Academy site
- Staggered finish to the day
- Cleaning regime during the day with cloakroom/toilet supervisors keeping toilet areas monitored, with additional measures to be undertaken by staff/students after using venues
- Strong emphasis on personal hygiene
- Good ventilation to be maintained in all working areas wherever possible
- Supportive and caring environment for staff and students
- Timely and measured response to any symptomatic staff or students working closely with public health authorities and readiness to apply contingency measures if required

- Hygiene and cleaning
- Ventilation and social distancing in venues
- Students or staff displaying symptoms
- Student emotional distress
- Vulnerable staff and family members

Control measures

You should:

- Ensure good hygiene for everyone
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19
- Take preventative measures

- 1. If a student or member of staff tests positive, they are expected to notify the Academy immediately.
- 2. Staff and students will adhere to the latest Government guidance in relation to isolation rules.
- 3. Contacts of positive cases will be managed by the local Public Health Team but there is no longer a legal requirement to self-isolate-
- 4. If there is a localised outbreak of cases in the School the Public Health Team may insist on further preventative controls to be re-introduced.
- 5. Meetings with parents/visitors are permitted on site.
- 6. The use of face coverings for staff and students is optional-

- 1. Hand sanitiser is provided in all classrooms, on all corridors and in the Restaurant.
- 2. Students permitted to enter the building at 8.20 am and move straight to their classroom.
- 3. Year group assemblies have resumed.
- 4. Face coverings are optional for staff and students on the Academy premises.
- 5. A staggered finish for students between 2.50pm 3.20pm.

- 1. Staff are encouraged to call if any resources need to be replaced.
- 2. Extra sanitisers and refills in each classroom/venue.
- 3. Regular hand washing/sanitising encouraged.
- 4. Tissues, blue roll and common disinfectant is available in classrooms.
- 5. IT equipment is wiped down before and after each use.
- 6. Use of shared resources to be minimal and equipment and resources sanitised regularly including computer work stations.
- 7. Toilet supervisors clean throughout the day.
- 8. Washing hands prompts and reminders displayed around the Academy.
- 9. Regular reminders on the importance of good personal hygiene to be shared on broadcast.
- 10. Explicit teaching & posters on how to cough/sneeze into the bend in your arm and catch it, bin it, kill it.
- 11. Bins to be emptied regularly and high touch points cleaned.
- 12. Cleaning team will be available all day to assist with cleaning procedures.
- 13. Student toilets to be monitored to ensure limited numbers of students mixing and reduced contact time.
- 14. The Academy will participate in the 12 15 COVID-19 vaccination programme, run by the local Immunisation Team.

- 1. All occupied venues should maximise ventilation whenever possible. This includes opening doors and windows to encourage the circulation of air.
- 2. In colder weather, thought needs to be given to a balance between good circulation and the room temperature. This may involve intermittent opening of windows during the day.
- 3. Teachers should continue to keep a sensible social distance from students in teaching venues and other areas at all times. They should position students away from the teaching desk space whenever possible.
- 4. A student seating plan should also be kept for every session with students encouraged to distance from each other when appropriate to do so.

- 1. The UK Health Security Agency has the latest guidance on Covid 19 and is updated regularly.
- 2. Students and staff will be strongly advised to remain at home if they are feeling unwell, as the legal requirement to isolate has been removed.
- 3. All staff to remain vigilant of student welfare throughout every session and around school.
- 4. The Medical Room will be the designated area for holding students with COVID-19 symptoms and will be cleaned thoroughly between users.
- 5. Students and staff will sit on plastic chairs only.
- 6. PPE clothing will be available for staff who may have to attend to a student or colleague requiring support or medical attention.
- 7. A good stock of disposable aprons, gloves and face masks are available in addition to face visors offered to all staff that might be involved in managing students presenting symptoms.
- 8. The school will work closely with the local health protection team where necessary.

- 1. Small numbers of students may require support for their emotional needs.
- 2. Students may have lost a loved one or experienced a difficult time because of COVID-19.
- 3. Refer all cases of concern to Duncan Marshall who will delegate referrals as appropriate.
- 4. The Nurture Room is in operation and will be used as a safe space to support vulnerable children.
- 5. The Personal Tutor remains the first point of contact. Communication can still continue via email and telephone and personal tutors should make a concerted effort to look out for the welfare of all their students as always.

- 1. Those who are clinically extremely vulnerable must take particular care while community infection rates continue to rise and fall.
- 2. Clinically extremely vulnerable staff are advised to discuss concerns with the Academy in line with Government guidance. An individual risk assessment should be agreed with the line manager.
- 3. Those who are clinically vulnerable e.g. asthmatic or people with particular characteristics which may put them at comparatively increased risk of COVID-19. If individuals are concerned we recommend a discussion takes place with their line manager and the Academy will try and accommodate any additional measures that may be necessary.
- 4. Once informed of a pregnancy, the Academy will consider how best to ensure the individuals health and safety in the workplace.
- 5. Pregnant colleagues and the Academy will refer to the latest guidance from the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists https://www.rcog.org.uk
- 6. The Academy will consider the risks before and after 28 weeks of pregnancy.
- 7. Those living with someone who is clinically extremely vulnerable or clinically vulnerable can attend the Academy and work with children.
