The Four Pillars that support the study of religious education are:

- Concept – belief systems are built on a worldview of what is real and what has value in a person's life.
- Knowledge – knowing the key terms and their meanings for the belief system supports understanding of a worldview.
- Skills – Religious education promotes a variety of skills, study skills and analytical skills
- Attitudes – by studying other people's beliefs, we encourage soft skills like tolerance and compassion.
