State of the Art Facilities & Resources

We are committed to preserving the learning environment for our students. The focal point of the building is a 48 place fitness studio which sits behind Reception. The Academy also has:

- A Vocational Training Centre
- Extensive sports facilities including flood-lit grass and synthetic turf pitches
- Library facilities available for students before and after school
- A Restaurant serving Breakfast and Lunch including vending machines dispensing hot drinks and water
- Medical Treatment we have a Medical Officer and a team of staff who are qualified first aiders.
 This enables us to deal with basic medical problems which may arise during Academy hours

Parental Involvement

We welcome a close working relationship with parents; it is central to the Academy's success. Parents are actively encouraged to become involved in a variety of ways. We will keep you informed of any issued and invite you in to discuss concerns. We also like to keep parents/carers informed of good work and progress in general.

We ask parents to help us to educate their children by:

- ensuring your child comes to the Academy every day
- keeping us informed of problems your child may be experiencing which could affect their school life or work
- Maintain regular contact with Personal Tutors to discuss achievements and set targets for future progress

- In the interests of efficiency and economy, wherever possible the Academy uses email addresses and text messaging to communicate information to parents/carers. For example, if a sporting fixture has been cancelled or the return journey from a trip has been delayed.
- In addition, information will be posted on the Academy's website and App which parents/ carers are able to access at their convenience. Parents/Carers are requested to log-in to change any contact details throughout the year.

Care for your Child

- The Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of young people.
 We work in line with current safeguarding guidance 'Keeping Children Safe in Education September 2021.'
- Our Accessibility Plan ensures that the physical conditions in the Academy do not result in students with disabilities being treated less favourably than other students.
- Students will join a tutor group with other students from their year group. This allows Year Managers to have easy access to the groups to offer them advice and support.
- Every student is valued at Madeley Academy.
 Every effort is made to meet the individual needs of each student across the curriculum for them to reach their full potential. This includes Most Able students.
- Mr Hall is the person who will oversee the students in Year 7 to ensure they get the best support possible. The tutor is your first point of contact with the Academy if you have queries or concerns.

Safety and Security

- The Academy has a closed circuit television security system supported by on-site security personnel and closed circuit cameras.
- For transport purposes, coaches and minibuses used by the Academy always have seat belts
- A single point of entry system with a manned security gate closely monitors all visitors to the Academy
- All students are expected to stay on site during the Academy day


Academy Uniform

There is a full Academy uniform policy and students are expected to conform to this. There is also an Academy sports kit for Physical Education. The only school bag allowed is the official Madeley Academy Bag which is issued free of charge to all students. The Academy expects parents/carers to be supportive and ensure their child is provided with a uniform and that it is worn properly.

Due to Health & Safety regulations the Academy must insist upon students following the rules with regard to jewellery, which are:

- No earrings, but one stud will be allowed in each ear
- Tongue, lip, nose, eyebrow or any other body piercings are not allowed
- · One ring will be allowed
- Students who wear bracelets and necklaces that constitute a hazard will be asked to remove them. It should also be noted that for some activities students may be requested to remove jewellery for safety reasons.





Careers Information, Advice and Guidance, The Extended Curriculum

The importance of Careers guidance and support is paramount for all students from Year 7 through to and including the Sixth Form.

Madeley Academy employs a full-time Executive Director of Careers and careers specialists to enhance career preparation and facilitate experiences with employers. The aim of the department is for every student to have the right skills to enable them to plan their career during their time at the Academy and beyond.

Our University Programme includes:

- Promotion of Summer schools for students in Years 10, 11 and the Sixth Form
- Trips to University master classes and study days
- Individual guidance from the Careers staff on course choice and back-up plans
- · Visits to Higher Education fairs
- Special one-to-one help with UCAS Personal statements
- Quality control of every student's application to University
- Oxford, Cambridge, Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary application preparation programme for high potential students including Open Day visits, admissions test preparation and interview technique guidance
- A Careers and Higher Education

 to complete UCAS preparation. The


Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme

Curriculum

Our curriculum aims to give students a broad education, which includes vocational courses and establishing a clear career path.

Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 & 9)

- When students come to the Academy, they are set by ability in core subjects. Students with low literacy levels on transfer from primary school will undertake the Ruth Miskin Synthetic Phonics programme to ensure literacy levels reach a minimum standard allowing them to be successful learners. Numeracy intervention is also put in place as part of an enrichment curriculum for the lowest ability students.
- A Most Able programme is in place to challenge talented students including STEM activities, links to Universities and a full programme of Music lessons
- Students are taught English, Mathematics, Science, Geography, History, Design & Technology, PE, Performing Arts, Art, ICT, Modern Foreign Language, Enterprise, Personal, Social, Health & Economic Education, Relationships and Sex Education.

Key Stage 4 (Years 10 & 11)

Students follow a broad curriculum based around English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science, and a Humanities subject. All students access core Physical Education. They then have further subject choices to enhance their curriculum.

Sixth Form Provision

Students will have the opportunity to continue their education in our Sixth Form providing they meet entry requirements. All students follow a 4 course programme and formal assessment takes place at the end of Y12 and then in Y13. Further details of courses available can be found on the Academy's website.

A current and predicted level is also given so you can check progress. During the year a more detailed report is also prepared. A Consultation Evening is held each year to enable parents/carers to spend time with their child's tutor reviewing progress and targets.

Sixth Form at Madeley Academy

Madeley Academy is in the top 5% of Sixth Forms nationally for the fifth year running. This means that every student in every subject out-performs their target grade, making us the top performing provider locally (Telford & Shrewsbury). All students study 4 A Level equivalents in Year 12, and then have the option to drop to 3 courses in Year 13.



Madeley Academy is in the top 5% of Sixth Forms nationally and received outstanding comments from Ofsted in May 2017 in terms of **curriculum**, **standards**, **careers and leadership**.

It offers a range of course combinations to ensure that students from across Telford have the very best foundations for the future. The 4 course programme offers more choice to students and keeps career options more flexible.

The curriculum is enriched by opportunities such as The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and a comprehensive sports programme, as well as work experience and volunteering placements.

Our facilities are fantastic and include a state-ofthe-art Fitness Centre and modern Sixth Form Café. Sixth Formers benefit from our in-house careers service which provides one-to-one career plans and advice in wide ranging fields. During the Ofsted Inspection in April 2017, HM Inspectors were very complimentary about our Sixth Form:



Admissions

Madeley Academy welcomes children of all abilities and children with physical disabilities. The published Pupil Admission Number (PAN) into Year 7 is 180. If the Academy does not receive 180 applications, every applicant will be offered a place. However, if the Academy is oversubscribed, all children who apply for a place at the Academy will be invited to attend a non-verbal reasoning assessment which will last for one hour and will be held at Madeley Academy. Children cannot "fail" the assessment.

Following the assessment, children will be placed in one of five ability bands based upon their score. The assessment results will be used to ensure that the Academy admits the full range of ability of applicants, with 36 students in each ability band being offered a place. The first children to be placed in the ability bands will be:

1. Looked After Children and Previously Looked After Children

Children in Public Care (Looked after Children) will be given highest priority for admission within each band. Looked after Children are children who are in the care of a Local Authority or provided with accommodation by a Local Authority. This also includes looked after children who were previously looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted, became subject to a child arrangement or special guardianship order.

2. Siblings

These are children who have on the day of admission, a brother, sister, step brother, step sister, half-brother or half-sister in Years 7 to 10 living as a family at the same address who attend the Academy.

3. Exceptional Health Reasons

Those children that have exceptional health reasons where there is written medical evidence that admission to the Academy is essential for their well-being will also be given priority.
